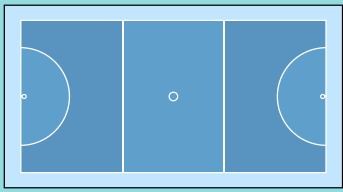
TWO TEAMS

Netball is a ball sport played by two teams of seven players. Games are played on a rectangular court with raised goal rings attached to a 3.05 metres (10 feet) high post at each end.

GOALS!

THE GOAL

The object is to score goals from within a defined area, by throwing a ball into the ring. The winning team is the one that scores the most goals. Standard games consist of 4 x 10 minute quarters and are played in Sections 3 – 17. Championship games consist of 4 x 15 minute quarters and are played by teams in Section 1. Section 2 consists of 4 x 12 minute quarters.



THE COURT

The court is broken up into thirds. The game starts with a pass from the centre circle. The game is played over four quarters and can be played on indoor and outdoor courts.

SEVEN POSITIONS

Players are assigned specific positions, which define their roles within the team and restrict their movement to certain areas of the court. A player with the ball can hold onto it for only three seconds before shooting for a goal or passing to another player.

ABOUT

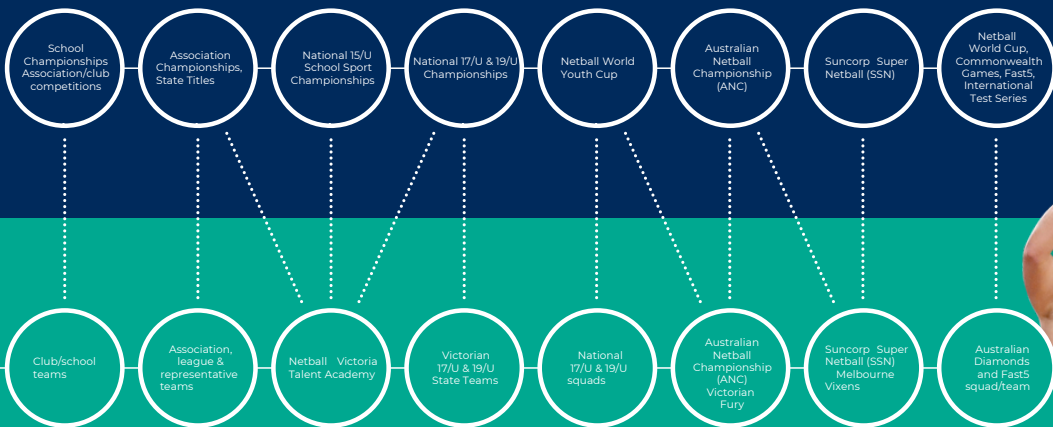
Range from Section 22 (lowest level) to Section 1 (Highest level). Teams are allocated to sections at the discretion of Whitehorse Netball Association.
